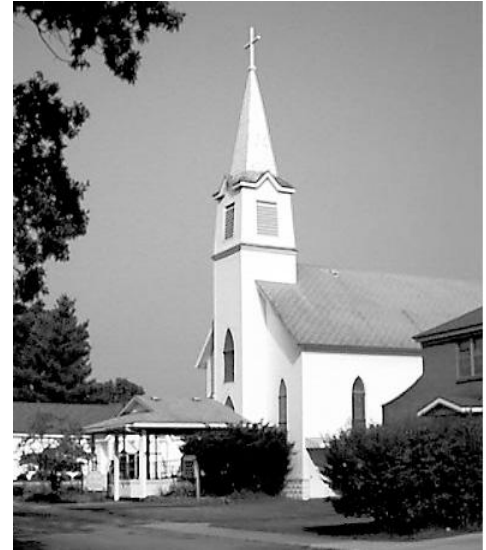

Torture, Trust and War - Presented by Fr. John Geaney, CSP
Thursdays, July 28, August 4 and 11, 7:00pm – 8:30pm

Can a nation morally allow prisoners to be tortured? When does interrogation step over the line and begin to dehumanize the person being questioned? Is there such a thing as a just war in a nuclear age? Can an evil person be killed in the name of justice? Father G will discuss the issues involved in the questions just mentioned with the aim of reflecting the moral position of the Church about interrogation methods such as were

used at Abu Ghraib, and defining when and if military forces are morally able to choose targets for destruction.

Cinema for Reflection – The Michael Moore Anthology - Presented by Fr. Marcos Zamora, CSP
Mondays, August 1, 8, and 15, 2:00 – 4:00pm
Three afternoons with Michael Moore films to highlight various social justice issues for reflection and discussion.

- 8/1 – *Bowling for Columbine (2002)* Explores the possible causes for the Columbine High School massacre and other acts of violence with guns. The film focuses on the environment in which the event took place and some common public opinions about related issues as well as the nature of violence in the United States.
- 8/8 – *Capitalism: A love story (2009)* This film centers on the financial crisis of 2007-2010 and the recovery stimulus. Topics include Wall Street's “casino mentality,” for-profit prisons, poverty-level wages of many workers, the large wave of home foreclosures, corporate owned insurance, and the consequences of runaway greed. The film also features a religious component where Moore examines whether or not capitalism is a sin and if Jesus would be a capitalist.
- 8/15 – *Sicko (2007)* This film investigates health care in the United States, focusing on its health insurance and the pharmaceutical industries. The movie compares the for-profit, non-universal U.S. system with the non-profit universal health care systems of Canada, the United Kingdom, France and Cuba.
