**UPDATE ON LITURGICAL ADAPTATIONS  
DUE TO INFLUENZA OUTBREAK**

All parishes have received an update from Archbishop Niederauer who has remained in touch with medical professionals regarding the precautions taken by the Church during the influenza outbreak.

No end date for the adaptations has been determined. Although the flu has been mild for most healthy adults, it continues to spread without resistance, and it can be much more severe for certain at-risk people. This past week, the World Health Organization moved the world to Phase 6, the agency's highest alert level—which means a pandemic, or global epidemic, is under way. In California, we have seen an increase in reported cases of 12% two weeks ago and 21% this past week. Archbishop Niederauer has indicated that he will begin to consider lifting the liturgical adaptations when we see the number of confirmed and probable cases decreasing rather than increasing.

All parishes have been asked to continue their vigilance and good hygiene practices, especially among the ministers of Communion serving within Mass and visiting the sick.

**MISSION COOPERATION PLAN 2009**

This weekend, June 20th and 21st, we welcome Fr. Priscus Jumamosi who will speak at all Masses on behalf of his Missionary work in Tanzania. Fr. Jumamosi is a Missionary of the Apostolic Life Community of Priests in the Opus Spiritus Sancti. The community's primary ministries are in education, health and pastoral work in missions. In Tanzania, the group plays a role in bringing people to the faith as well as educating and housing seminarians to serve in missions throughout their region. There are envelopes in the pews.
