The Mass will be offered for the intention of Betty Moyer and her husband Bill and family. There will be Mass on Tuesday July 27<sup>th</sup> at St. Mark at 6:00 pm and Wednesday July 28<sup>th</sup> at St. Joseph at 8:00 am.**

**Betty Moyer, 84, will be buried on Monday July 26<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 am at the Dayton cemetery. Betty and her husband Bill were active in St. Joseph Church until they moved to California 26 years ago. Viewing will be Sunday, July 25<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 to 6:00 pm at Dayton's Hubbard Rogg Chapel. Fr. Bob will conduct the graveside service.**

On Wednesday, August 4<sup>th</sup> **Bishop Blasé Cupich** (*pronounced Soo-pitch*) will join the priests of the diocese at Bishop White Seminary to celebrate the feast of St. John Vianney, the patron of parish priests. St. John Vianney was the pastor in the little town of Ars near Lyon in France. His church was about the size of St. Joseph in Dayton. Known as the Cure of Ars, St. John Vianney became famous for the celebration of the sacrament of penance, also known now as the sacrament of reconciliation.

**The official welcome of Bishop Cupich will be Friday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> at 11:00 am at the Gonzaga Arena. All parishioners are invited to attend. No ticket or registration is necessary. This will not be an ordination; Bishop Cupich is already ordained a bishop. It will be a Mass with visiting bishops and three cardinals, Maloney from Los Angeles, George from Chicago and probably McCarrick from New Jersey are attending.**

**Thanks to Joe Fondahn** for the donation of two trees, the ornamental cherry for the front yard and the oak for the back yard. Joe took the initiative to choose trees, plant them and arrange for a water system. Joe thought trees would be beautiful and came to Mass on Sunday with two cherry trees.
